Baptist Convention of Iowa CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I, NAME

The name of this body is Baptist Convention of Iowa.

ARTICLE II, PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this Convention to offer an Agency of Cooperation for the churches and missions, to promote the preaching of the gospel in Iowa and throughout the world, to support ministerial and Christian education, to organize and promote all phases of work fostered by this Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention, and to aid any benevolent or moral movements it may deem promotive of God's Kingdom.

ARTICLE III, AUTHORITY

- 1. The Convention shall have ultimate control of any institutions that have been, or may be, acquired by or originated in this body.
- 2. The Convention shall choose for each institution a board of trustees, in number according to the charter of each institution, and fix their terms of service, reserving the right to change the terms of service of such trustees and to remove from office any and all of them at will. Boards of trustees and other agencies shall in everything be subject to the control of this Convention.
- 3. The Convention reserves the right, as plainly implied in the first section of this article, to effect a change in the charter of any of its institutions. Any institution which desires to amend its charter shall submit the proposed amendment in writing to the Convention for its approval, provided that the proposed changes be submitted in writing to the Convention on the first day of its meeting and be voted on the second day.
- 4. Trustees shall make such annual and special reports of their expenditures and of the state of their respective institutions as this Convention may require.
- 5. No trustee shall be paid a salary, fee, or commission by the institution he serves as trustee.
- 6. While independent and sovereign in its own affairs, this Convention recognizes the autonomy of churches and associations and disclaims all right of exercising authority over any church, association or any other Baptist institution not under the management of this Convention.

ARTICLE IV, MEMBERSHIP

The Convention shall consist of messengers who are members of Baptist Churches and Missions cooperating with the Convention selected on either a numerical or financial basis. A cooperating church shall be defined as one participating in and contributing to the causes of the Baptist Convention of Iowa, i.e., cooperative program and missions giving. Each messenger shall be a member of the church which elects him/her.

- 1. On a numerical basis: two messengers shall be allowed from each cooperating church or mission of fifty members or less and one other messenger for every additional fifty members.
- 2. On a financial basis: one messenger shall be allowed from each cooperating church or mission for any part of the first two hundred dollars contributed to the work of the Convention, one additional messenger for the next five hundred dollars above the first two hundred dollars contributed to the work of the Convention, and one additional messenger for each two hundred dollars contributed to the work of the Convention above the first seven hundred dollars.
- 3. The messengers shall be elected and certified by the churches to the Convention with no church having more than ten (10) messengers.
- 4. The records as shown in the last published annual of the Baptist Convention of Iowa shall be used to determine the number of messengers from any one church.

ARTICLE V, OFFICERS

- 1. The officers of the Convention shall be president, a first vice president, a second vice president, a secretary, and a treasurer.
- 2. All officers except the treasurer shall be elected at each annual meeting of the Convention, the president on the evening of the first day and the vice presidents in the same session or the morning session of the second day. Their term of office shall begin at the close of that annual convention.
- 3. The executive director-treasurer elected by the Executive Board of the Convention shall serve as the treasurer of the Convention.
- 4. The term of the office for the president is limited to two years, and he shall not be eligible for re-election until as much as one year has elapsed from the time his successor is named.
- 5. No employee of the Convention, its several institutions, agencies, or programs of work receiving compensation from the convention's budget shall be eligible to serve as president, 1st vice president, or 2nd vice president.

6. Officers of the Convention, officers and members of boards of trustees, and members of committees of the Convention shall hold membership in a church affiliated with and in cooperation with the Baptist Convention of Iowa.

ARTICLE VI, DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- 1. President: The duties of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Convention and serve as chairman of the Executive Board; while presiding at meetings, maintain order, decide all points of order except those appealed to the body, and to appoint the committee on committees. It shall be the president's privilege to speak as any other person, provided one of the vice presidents has been called to the chair. The president shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees, except when he chooses to ask one of the vice presidents to serve.
- 2. First Vice-President shall act in full capacity of president when the president is unable to fulfill the responsibilities or the office is vacant, or when the president chooses to invite the vice president to serve. The first vice president shall serve as ex-officio to the executive board.
- 3. Second Vice-President shall be available to preside when called upon by the President. The Second Vice-President shall act in full capacity of the First Vice-President when the First Vice-President is unable to fulfill the responsibilities or the office is vacant.
- 4. The Secretary shall record all proceedings of the Convention in session and the executive board in its meetings. The secretary shall keep a file of the minutes in a fireproof protection. This file constitutes the authentic record of the convention.
- 5. The Executive Director-Treasurer, elected by the executive board of the Convention, shall serve as treasurer of the Convention.
 - a) The treasurer shall receive and disburse the general and designated funds of the Convention as authorized by the Convention in session.
 - b) He shall have charge of invested and trust funds, invest and disburse the same, collect and disburse interest thereon, subject in both cases to instructions of the convention or of its administrative committee and the executive board.
 - c) He shall make an annual report to the executive board for its approval and to the Convention for its approval of all receipts, disbursements, expenses, and investments.
 - d) His books shall be audited/reviewed by a certified public accountant. A statement by the auditor/accountant concerning the audit/review and the Convention's business will be published in the minutes.

6. The President, First Vice-President, and Secretary shall constitute the Executive Officers of the Executive Board and shall have all the powers formerly entrusted to Trustees. However, nothing in this Constitution shall be deemed to require said Executive Officers to be held to the same legal standard as a Trustee to the extent that such legal standards exceed those that would be applicable to a corporate officer.

ARTICLE VII, THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

At the annual meeting the Convention shall nominate and elect an executive board of the Baptist Convention of Iowa.

- 1. The executive board of the Baptist Convention of Iowa shall consist of 21 regular members plus the president, first vice president, and secretary. One third shall be elected each year to serve a three-year term.
- 2. Two members shall be chosen from each association.
- 3. There shall be seven members chosen as at-large members which will properly represent more heavily populated areas of the state.
- 4. An effort shall be made to ensure balance between pastors and laity, and between male and female; however, the primary consideration for selection of executive board members shall be their expertise to serve effectively.
- 5. When vacancies occur between annual meetings of the convention, these may be filled upon recommendation of the executive board nominating committee and a two-thirds vote of the executive board present and voting.
- 6. All members of the board shall be members in good standing of Baptist churches which cooperate with the Convention in its programs of work and the Cooperative Program.
- 7. A member shall be elected for a term of three years and may be re-elected for a second three-year term. After a lapse of one year he may serve again if elected.
- 8. Nominees shall hold membership in a BCI affiliated church within the ministry area of an association at least one year before being eligible to serve on the Convention's executive board. Persons moving from an association or at large area to another shall vacate their position on the Board.
- 9. Members of the Executive Board may be removed in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation, Article IX.

ARTICLE VIII, DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

- 1. The executive board shall be the executive, administrative, and promotional agency of the Convention and shall act under the instructions of the Convention, acting in its own capacity as a body through its administrative committee.
- 2. The executive board shall recommend to the Convention both a proposed goal or objective for raising funds, and a proposed distribution. The board shall promote all missionary, educational and benevolent causes of the Convention, and receive and disburse all funds according to the annual budget adopted by the Convention.
- 3. The executive board shall have authority to act, as a body or through its administrative committee, in all matters committed to it by the Convention and in matters which may arise between Convention sessions.
- 4. With the exception of the state office building, the executive board shall have authority to purchase, sell or lease property and to incur indebtedness necessary for the operation of the Convention. The state office building shall not be sold or leased without the approval of the messengers in an annual or called meeting.
- 5. It shall be the specific duty of each member of the board to promote the Convention's program in his/her respective area of the state.
- 6. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum after every member has been notified sufficiently in advance.

ARTICLE IX, THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

- 1. The Convention shall elect the executive board annually. The president, first vice president, secretary and the chairpersons of the board's standing committees shall serve as the Convention's administrative committee. The standing committees are: Evangelism and Ministries Committee, Missions Committee and Church Health Committee. Standing committees may be changed, added or deleted at the discretion of the executive board. The past president shall serve as ex-officio for one year following his term as president.
- 2. The president of the Convention shall serve as president of the administrative committee and the recording secretary shall serve as secretary.
- 3. Members of the administrative committee shall not receive compensation from the Convention budget, nor may members of their immediate families.

ARTICLE X, DUTIES OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

- 1. The administrative committee shall act under the authority of the executive board and/or the Convention in any matter committed to it by the board or by the Convention.
- 2. The committee shall act on any emergency administrative matter and its action shall carry the authority of the Convention, subject to review by the executive board.
- 3. The committee shall not involve the Board nor Convention in financial obligations or project any major plans or work not authorized by the Board or the Convention.
- 4. A majority of the committee shall constitute a quorum after every member has been notified sufficiently in advance.
- 5. The administrative committee shall serve as the budget and audit committee for the Convention and shall meet with the executive director-treasurer to prepare the budget which is to be presented to the executive board in its September meeting and then the Board shall present the budget to the Convention in its annual session.

ARTICLE XI, ALTERATIONS

Any alterations may be made in these articles by a vote of two-thirds of the members present when the vote is taken without regard to the total enrollment at any annual meeting of the convention, provided that:

- 1. Any proposed amendment shall be presented in the book of reports and read on the first day of the Convention.
- 2. An amendment shall become effective upon approval by two successive Conventions.
- 3. The Bylaws may be changed by a simple majority vote in Annual Meeting.

Bylaws Bylaw I – Disbursements

- 1. All Cooperative Program receipts to the Convention shall be disbursed according to percentages or amounts approved by the Convention in its annual budget.
- 2. Special gifts shall be applied according to the instructions of the donors in keeping with charitable contribution laws and the guidelines of the executive board and agency trustees.
- 3. Undesignated gifts may be applied as the Convention wills.
- 4. The treasurer(s) of the Convention funds and institutions shall be bonded for faithful performance of duty, said bond(s) to be approved by the administrative committee of the executive board

Bylaw II - MEETINGS

- 1. The Convention shall choose its meeting times and place.
- 2. The administrative committee of the executive board, when sufficient emergency arises as to time or place, may change the annual meeting either as to time or place or both.
- 3. Special meetings of the Convention shall be called by the president upon approval of the administrative committee. Those present, after at least a thirty-day notice has been presented by the president, shall constitute a quorum.
- 4. The Convention shall use the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order to guide its parliamentary procedures. A parliamentarian may be appointed by the president of the Convention.

Bylaw III - CONVENTION COMMITTEES

1. Committee on Committees:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall serve to nominate members of those committees specifically related to the Convention. These committees shall include a Credentials Committee, Program Committee, Executive Board Nominating Committee, Constitution Review Committee, Resolutions Committee, History Committee and other continuing committees created by the Convention.
- b) Functions: Nominations for members on these committees, including a stipulation of which member shall be chair, shall be presented at the last session of the annual meeting of the Convention. After opportunity for nominations from the floor, these committees shall be elected by the Convention and shall serve from the conclusion of that Convention meeting.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee of five (5) members shall be appointed by the president at the last session of the Convention and shall begin serving at the close of that session. Members shall be appointed for one year. The president shall stipulate which person shall serve as chair.

2. Credentials Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall serve as the registration committee for the Convention's annual meeting.
- b) Function: As the Convention's registration committee during the annual meeting of the convention, this committee shall organize necessary procedures to effect the orderly certifying and seating of messengers.

All questions of registration of messengers shall be referred to this committee. This committee shall make reports to the Convention as to numbers of messengers and guests registered.

c) Composition and Selection: There shall be five (5) members of this committee on a rotating basis with members elected annually for three years.

3. Program Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall plan and recommend the program for the annual meeting of the Convention.
- b) Function: This committee shall plan the next annual program sufficiently far in advance that provisional programs can be publicized to the constituency not less than one month before the scheduled meeting of that Convention. This committee shall recommend to the Convention the date and place of meeting for the next two (2) years. Previously published dates and places shall be used except when special reasons for changing are noted and approved by the Convention or the Executive Board.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of five (5) members elected to serve one (1) year.

4. Executive Board Nominating Committee:

- a) Purpose: It shall be the purpose of this committee to nominate members of the executive board, stipulating upon which of the three (3) committees they shall serve. It shall also be the responsibility of this committee to nominate the members of the Baptist Foundation Committee.
- b) Function: Annually, seven (7) members shall be nominated for three (3) years for each of the three (3) committees of the executive board, in addition to the filling of vacancies. The committee shall nominate two (2) members each year for a three (3) year term for the Baptist Foundation Committee. The primary consideration of this committee shall be that those persons being nominated shall have special abilities or expertise that equips them to serve effectively in the area of their specified committee. An effort shall be made to see there is geographical representation as well as a balance between ministers and lay persons, and between male and female. Such concern for balance; however, shall not override concern for electing persons with skills to serve on the various committees. (Article VII, Executive Board)

c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of six (6) members serving on a rotating basis, with two (2) elected annually for three (3) years.

5. Baptist Foundation Committee:

- a) Purpose: It shall be the purpose of this committee to serve the Baptist Convention of Iowa by receiving assets to be held and invested for the purpose for which they are received, i.e. scholarships, loan funds, mission funds. (Article II Section 2)
- b) Function: This committee shall receive and invest assets with the Executive Director-Treasurer serving as Chief Executive Officer working with the committee to serve Baptists in Iowa and the causes of Christ.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of six
 (6) members serving on a rotating basis with two (2) being elected annually for a three year term. A member shall serve no more than two
 (2) three year terms until the lapse of at least one year. The members shall be nominated to the Convention by the Executive Board Nominating Committee.

6. Constitution Review Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall review the constitution and by-laws for needed updating and revising, and shall receive referrals from the Convention.
- b) Function: This committee shall review the constitution and by-laws to be certain it is in harmony with the corporation charter and is consistent with all procedures and practices adopted by the Convention. This committee shall review and report to the executive board all motions for revision presented during the annual meeting of the Convention and/or to the executive board, with evaluations and recommendations ultimately being made to the Convention. This committee shall assist any messenger in presenting motions for revision to assure he shall be acquainted with proper procedures for amending the constitution and by-laws.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of six (6) members serving on a rotating basis, with two (2) elected annually for three (3) years.

7. Resolutions Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall receive all resolutions presented to the Convention.
- b) Function: All resolutions shall be referred to the Resolutions Committee no later than the first session of the annual meeting of the Convention, although the committee shall not be bound to include resolutions which in the committee's evaluation will not contribute to the unity and advancement of the Convention in their final report unless instructed to do so by two-thirds vote of the Convention.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of five (5) members elected for one (1) year.

8. History Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall be responsible for accumulating, indexing, and communicating to our constituency information about our history.
- b) Function: This committee shall bring to the attention of the Convention occasions when anniversaries or special events need to be commemorated. It shall print in the annual publication brief, updated digests of the history of the Baptist Convention of Iowa.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of three (3) members serving on a rotating basis with one (1) elected annually for three (3) years.

9. Baptist State Paper Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall relate to matters pertaining to the <u>Iowa Baptist</u>.
- b) Function: This committee shall meet with the editor and serve as advisory council in matters of the publication of the state paper.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of three (3) members serving on a rotating basis with one (1) elected annually for three (3) years. The members of this committee shall be nominated by the Committee on Committees.

Baptist Convention of Iowa Annual Meeting First Baptist Church, Winterset, Iowa November 4-5th, 2005

- 1. President Dan Doolin called the meeting to order. It was noted that this was the 10th annual meeting of the Convention and the 50th year of Southern Baptist work in Iowa. The host pastor, Mike Carlson, offered a welcome and prayer.
- 2. President Dan Doolin recognized Marion Livingston, chairman of the credentials committee to present his report to the convention. The report states that 115 messengers were recommended to be seated representing 41 churches and 33 guests were present. There was a recommendation from the committee that the convention seat messengers who have been, or will be, certified by the credentials committee throughout the course of the meeting. Motion passed.
- 3. The president called Mike Carlson, chairman of the program committee to present the report from the program committee. The committee recommends that the program be accepted as written and as may be adjusted by the president throughout the course of the meeting. The motion passed.
- 4. Mike Carlson brought a recommendation from the program committee that the 2006 annual meeting be held at Crestwood Baptist Church, Des Moines and that the 2007 annual meeting be held at Northbrook Baptist Church in Cedar Rapids. The motion passed.

President Dan Doolin directed the convention's attention to the Annual Report and the Strategy and Ministry Plan which will be presented and voted on Saturday morning. The second presentation of the constitution revisions will be read on Saturday morning as well. It was noted that we have been working under the guidance of the constitution for the past year and it has served us well.

- 2. President Dan Doolin asked for nominations for 1st vice president. Claude McFerron nominated Larry Carter. Mike Carlson gave the second. Dale Tripp made the motion that nominations cease. Motion passed and a vote was taken to elect Larry Carter as 1st vice president. Motion passed.
- 3. President Dan Doolin asked for nominations for 2^{nd} vice president. Bob Stout was nominated and Bob Stine gave the second. A motion was made that nominations cease. Motion passed. A vote was taken and Bob Stout was elected as 2^{nd} vice president.

President Dan Doolin invited the messengers to walk to the fellowship hall for refreshments and a missions celebration. The following persons gave reports and remarks:

The messengers adjourned and moved back to the sanctuary for more business. Jimmy Barrentine, executive director, presented his annual ministry report, the annual financial report and the annual foundation committee report.

- 4. President Dan Doolin recognized Mike Roberts who brought a report from the committee on committees. The committee recommends that the report be accepted. Motion passed.
- 5. President Dan Doolin recognized David Miller, chair of the executive board nominating committee. The committee recommends that the messengers adopt their report. Motion passed.
- 6. 1st vice president recognized president Dan Doolin to bring a recommendation from the executive board for the next two items of business.

President Dan Doolin brought a recommendation from the executive board that the convention adopt the Strategy Plan and Annual Ministry Plan. Motion passed.

President Dan Doolin brought a recommendation from the executive board that the convention adopt the second reading of the proposed constitutional revisions. Motion passed.

President Dan Doolin reported that his recommendations of those to serve on the Committee on Committees will be given at a later date and added to the record.

7. President Dan Doolin recognized Marion Livingston to present the resolutions committee report. The resolutions are as follows:

Resolution #1 - A resolution to establish within each church a Prayer Coordinator whose ministry it will be to use e-mail and other means to share daily, brief prayer and praise reminders with the congregation.

Whereas we are admonished by Jesus to agree together in prayer and are promised answers to prayer when we agree together on earth concerning matters of God's will; and

Whereas the ministry of an individual who is prayerful and alert to needs of individuals, families, and churches is needed to utilize e-mail to disseminate prayer and praise information; and

Whereas a person is needed with whom anyone can send prayer requests for dissemination to the members of church; and

Whereas a person in each church can daily send prayer requests and reminders to the congregation through e-mail and other methods; and

Whereas a person designated within each church can bring before the congregation the names of BCI staff, missions and churches; and

Whereas a daily ministry of sending brief e-mail prayer requests has proven invaluable in uniting the church in prayer; and

Whereas the ministry of prayer coordinator has resulted in a multiplication of prayer in churches which have a person in charge of this ministry;

Be it therefore resolved that the messengers to this convention return to their congregation with the suggestion that a dedicated person be elected "prayer coordinator" on an annual basis so that the benefits of such a ministry will strengthen prayer life of individuals and churches within the Baptist Convention of Iowa.

Resolution #2 - May it be resolved that the messengers of the Baptist Convention of Iowa express our thanks to First Baptist Church of Winterset, for hosting the 1995 meeting to form the Baptist Convention of Iowa, and also for hosting the 10th anniversary meeting of the convention.

This year is a historical year of importance and reflection for us as Iowa Baptists because of our celebration of a decade of being a convention and the tremendous devastation to the gulf coast caused by Hurricane Katrina in August. There are many things to recall and remember concerning these great events that cause us as Baptists to sit and ponder as we reflect upon our belief and trust in God and His call upon our lives to be His people in good times and bad. As the scripture teaches, "God is the same yesterday, today, and forever," and his motive and movement in the world is still the same today as it was yesterday. As Jesus said, "My father is always at work and I, too, am also at work." [my paraphrase of John 5:17].

Today, we sit in a hallowed place, First Baptist Church – Winterset, IA. It was here ten years ago that the messengers of the Iowa Baptist Fellowship came together to take a courageous and careful step of faith as we moved from a fellowship to a state convention. Our numbers were small, relatively speaking in convention life among other states, but our belief in God was great and our determination was grand. The call was renewed to reach our state and our world with the good news of Jesus Christ.

It is an honor to serve the convention as president upon this historical day as we celebrate our 10 years of existence as a convention. I can't help but reflect upon the people and faces of people we may never have known or heard of who faced the fields and communities of Iowa for the first time. Today we celebrate 97 congregations that are still carrying out this effort all because a few people over fifty years ago dared to go where Southern Baptists had not gone before.

It is a joy to relive our history and to see the good parts of history repeat itself. As a family of believers, we were sad to lose our dear brother in ministry, Dr. Ed Gregory, as he and his wife, Cynthia, responded to the call of Alaska, but God was in complete control as he brought Richard Lamborn back to the state office in Des Moines to serve as Interim Director of State Missions. On behalf of Iowa Baptists, I extend a wonderful thank you to Richard for his faithful service during the interim period and for his example of what it means to live out a life in the fields of Iowa. Thanks are also extended to Lois, Richard's wife, who shared her husband once again with the people of Iowa. And now what joy it is to embrace a new beginning in State Missions as God has brought Steve Murdock and his family to our state to dream a new dream (or continue living out the original dream) of starting multiple new churches across our great state.

In speaking about the men and the women who embrace this dream every day, I am extremely grateful for all of the staff who work in Des Moines and throughout our associations. Without their dedicated work, we, as Iowa Baptists, would not be celebrating this wonderful day of history. Thank you on behalf of the people who assemble every Sunday in a new church start or in a healthy established church, or even a struggling congregation that is there because of your

faithfulness to God. Some may not even know your name, but one day they will meet you at the throne of God because you have sacrificed in these fields of service. My challenge to you as staff is to keep challenging us to dream the dream and to leave a legacy that will help a new generation of churches celebrate multiple years of history.

God is never limited by our ability or our resources. Reflection upon the old and new budgets reveals that we are a state of little financial excess. The challenge for our churches to support the work of the convention will always be there. We are in a new day as churches. We need to think about how we can partner together to give more so that we can do more. We teach our children to become independent of Mom and Dad, and even though we will never become completely independent of the North American Mission Board and Lifeway Resources, we must take on more financial responsibility. A little increase in giving means we can do more as a group. I dream of the day when our state convention can have disaster relief as a line item in the budget and many other new ministries we haven't even thought about. But remember what I said, God is not limited to our money. He just asks us to be faithful with it!

By the time you read this report, many Iowa Southern Baptists will have traveled to the Gulf Coast to carry out the mission of helping the victims of Hurricane Katrina. Our lives will forever be changed and so will the heart of our nation. The response from the local church has been tremendous with the offering of money and personal service. What we see as disaster often becomes God's great opportunity. Lost people will come to know Christ and become saved from the greatest disaster of all – spending eternity away from God in Hell. May our vision change for the people we walk by every day. May we become challenged to once again become involved in the real disaster relief work of telling people about the love of Jesus.

Our past reveals our dependence upon God and so does our future. We must remain faithful as we respond to his leadership.

My life verse came to me while serving here in Iowa, as a church planter and I believe is applicable to us as a convention. Phil. 1:6 says, "Be confident in this, the He who began a good work in me will see it through to completion, until the day of Christ Jesus."

The executive board celebrated a special anniversary in 2005. John Shaull, associational missionary, Metro Baptist Association, has completed five years of faithful and commendable service.

Gregory now serves as the pastor of the First Baptist Church in Anchorage, Alaska. Iowa Baptists will want to continue to remember Ed and Cynthia in prayer.

Missions Team Steve Murdock, Missions Team Leader

Hitting the ground running would be an understatement in describing my first few weeks of service as missions team leader of the Baptist Convention of Iowa. Some say that smaller conventions have less work than larger ones. Nothing could be farther from the truth. But God is definitely working in the lives of Iowans, and the results are churches being planted in our midst.

Without question, the highlight of missions this year in Iowa is the golden anniversary of church planting in our state. The Baptist Convention of Iowa celebrates fifty years of church planting in Iowa this year, recalling the first Southern Baptist church planted in the state in 1954. Fairview Baptist Church in Anamosa, Iowa was the first SBC church planted in our state, and now, after fifty years, ninety-five churches are affiliated with our convention.

One focus for BCI church planting that was started this year is the new emphasis on raising resources from the harvest. In other words, Iowa churches should be planted and led by Iowans. If someone from outside the state feels led to plant or pastor a church here in Iowa, of course they should be encouraged to do so. But if our churches, associations and convention are to be healthy and growing, we must start looking to our own local congregations for the next generation of church planters and leaders.

Another turning point for missions in Iowa this year was the decision to implement the North American Mission Board's Church Planter System in starting churches. This system includes components such as Church Planter Basic Training, Mentor Training, Church Planter Networks, Church Planter Management System (software) and more. Churches, associations and conventions that have utilized this system across the country have had many disciples made and as a result many churches started. If used properly, this system will most likely be effective in Iowa as well.

BCI's partnership with the Tennessee Baptist Convention is also doing well, as we look for more ways the TBC churches can partner long-term with our church starts. We also hope to utilize more Missions Service Corps volunteers in various ministries across the state. Missions in Iowa are alive and well and will grow in the future as we seek to be God's Kingdom builders.

Evangelism & Ministries Team Ty Berry, Team Leader

General evangelism churches across Iowa have been urged to effectively engage in purposed evangelism ministry in their communities. We have entered our fourth year of focused evangelistic praying for renewal, and spiritual awakening across Iowa. Here are some highlights in evangelism across Iowa this year.

- Annual Men's Retreat, held at Boone Iowa was well attended and the men were challenged to God's call on their life. The retreat was lead by Arden Taylor from Tennessee.
- Kingdom Growth Conference (State Evangelism Conference) was held at Immanuel Baptist Church, Cedar Rapids. The focus was on evangelistic praying. The new format expanded training opportunities for church health and missions.
- Baptisms across Iowa this year were up again for our third straight increase. We are thankful for the 6.5% increase and continue to pray for more baptisms this year.
- Disaster Relief has been a busy year again. We have responded several times to area of Mississippi and Louisiana. We have trained over 135 people this year.
- Summer/Semester Missionaries have experienced some decline, with new changes developing from the North American Mission Board.
- Hunger Relief Ministries continue to be steadily increasing in ministries across Iowa.
 This year over 9800 people were helped with Hunger Relief/Crisis Ministry.

Our new member of the team: We welcome Jay McFarling, pastor of adults at Grace Church, Des Moines, who serves as our seminary education consultant for the new Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary extension center. Jay joins Mike Roberts, who will continue to serve as a consultant for basic and diploma level seminary extension efforts. Dianna Sparks is the children-preschool consultant. Troy Fiscella is our youth consultant (he also serves on the BCI evangelism and ministry team). Deland Myers serves as the adult ministry consultant. Rachel Nations is the special education consultant.

Our accomplishments this year: We were blessed to receive some additional funding from LifeWay Christian Resources this year that enabled us to undertake several special projects, which we pray will result in twice as many baptisms in BCI churches as the previous year. Some of these projects included grants for churches to hold VBS, to start new Sunday schools, to establish children's ministries, to do effective follow-up of evangelistic projects and to purchase evangelism training materials. We are praying for God to enable us to bring in a harvest of baptisms during this year. Join us in praying for a God-size goal of 1,200 baptisms statewide.
