Baptist Convention of Iowa  
CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I, NAME

The name of this body is Baptist Convention of Iowa.

ARTICLE II, PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this Convention to offer an Agency of Cooperation for the churches and missions, to promote the preaching of the gospel in Iowa and throughout the world, to support ministerial and Christian education, to organize and promote all phases of work fostered by this Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention, and to aid any benevolent or moral movements it may deem promotive of God's Kingdom.

ARTICLE III, AUTHORITY

1. The Convention shall have ultimate control of any institutions that have been, or may be, acquired by or originated in this body.
2. The Convention shall choose for each institution a board of trustees, in number according to the charter of each institution, and fix their terms of service, reserving the right to change the terms of service of such trustees and to remove from office any and all of them at will. Boards of trustees and other agencies shall in everything be subject to the control of this Convention.
3. The Convention reserves the right, as plainly implied in the first section of this article, to effect a change in the charter of any of its institutions. Any institution which desires to amend its charter shall submit the proposed amendment in writing to the Convention for its approval, provided that the proposed changes be submitted in writing to the Convention on the first day of its meeting and be voted on the second day.
4. Trustees shall make such annual and special reports of their expenditures and of the state of their respective institutions as this Convention may require.
5. No trustee shall be paid a salary, fee, or commission by the institution he serves as trustee.
6. While independent and sovereign in its own affairs, this Convention recognizes the autonomy of churches and associations and disclaims all right of exercising authority over any church, association or any other Baptist institution not under the management of this Convention.

## ARTICLE IV, MEMBERSHIP

The Convention shall consist of messengers who are members of Baptist Churches and Missions cooperating with the Convention selected on either a numerical or financial basis. A cooperating church shall be defined as one participating in and contributing to the causes of the Baptist Convention of Iowa, i.e., cooperative program and missions giving. Each messenger shall be a member of the church which elects him/her.

1. On a numerical basis: two messengers shall be allowed from each cooperating church or mission of fifty members or less and one other messenger for every additional fifty members.
2. On a financial basis: one messenger shall be allowed from each cooperating church or mission for any part of the first two hundred dollars contributed to the work of the Convention, one additional messenger for the next five hundred dollars above the first two hundred dollars contributed to the work of the Convention, and one additional messenger for each two hundred dollars contributed to the work of the Convention above the first seven hundred dollars.
3. The messengers shall be elected and certified by the churches to the Convention with no church having more than ten (10) messengers.
4. The records as shown in the last published annual of the Baptist Convention of Iowa shall be used to determine the number of messengers from any one church.

## ARTICLE V, OFFICERS

1. The officers of the Convention shall be president, a first vice president, a second vice president, a secretary, and a treasurer.
2. All officers except the treasurer shall be elected at each annual meeting of the Convention, the president on the evening of the first day and the vice presidents in the same session or the morning session of the second day. Their term of office shall begin at the close of that annual convention.
3. The executive director-treasurer elected by the Executive Board of the Convention shall serve as the treasurer of the Convention.
4. The term of the office for the president is limited to two years, and he shall not be eligible for re-election until as much as one year has elapsed from the time his successor is named.
5. No employee of the Convention, its several institutions, agencies, or programs of work receiving compensation from the convention's budget shall be eligible to serve as president, 1st vice president, or 2nd vice president.

6. Officers of the Convention, officers and members of boards of trustees, and members of committees of the Convention shall hold membership in a church affiliated with and in cooperation with the Baptist Convention of Iowa.

#### ARTICLE VI, DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. President: The duties of the president shall be to preside at all meetings of the Convention and serve as chairman of the Executive Board; while presiding at meetings, maintain order, decide all points of order except those appealed to the body, and to appoint the committee on committees. It shall be the president's privilege to speak as any other person, provided one of the vice presidents has been called to the chair. The president shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees, except when he chooses to ask one of the vice presidents to serve.
2. First Vice-President shall act in full capacity of president when the president is unable to fulfill the responsibilities or the office is vacant, or when the president chooses to invite the vice president to serve. The first vice president shall serve as ex-officio to the executive board.
3. Second Vice-President shall be available to preside when called upon by the President. The Second Vice-President shall act in full capacity of the First Vice-President when the First Vice-President is unable to fulfill the responsibilities or the office is vacant.
4. The Secretary shall record all proceedings of the Convention in session and the executive board in its meetings. The secretary shall keep a file of the minutes in a fireproof protection. This file constitutes the authentic record of the convention.
5. The Executive Director-Treasurer, elected by the executive board of the Convention, shall serve as treasurer of the Convention.
  - a) The treasurer shall receive and disburse the general and designated funds of the Convention as authorized by the Convention in session.
  - b) He shall have charge of invested and trust funds, invest and disburse the same, collect and disburse interest thereon, subject in both cases to instructions of the convention or of its administrative committee and the executive board.
  - c) He shall make an annual report to the executive board for its approval and to the Convention for its approval of all receipts, disbursements, expenses, and investments.
  - d) His books shall be audited/reviewed by a certified public accountant. A statement by the auditor/accountant concerning the audit/review and the Convention's business will be published in the minutes.

6. The President, First Vice-President, and Secretary shall constitute the Executive Officers of the Executive Board and shall have all the powers formerly entrusted to Trustees. However, nothing in this Constitution shall be deemed to require said Executive Officers to be held to the same legal standard as a Trustee to the extent that such legal standards exceed those that would be applicable to a corporate officer.

## ARTICLE VII, THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

At the annual meeting the Convention shall nominate and elect an executive board of the Baptist Convention of Iowa.

1. The executive board of the Baptist Convention of Iowa shall consist of 21 regular members plus the president, first vice president, and secretary. One third shall be elected each year to serve a three-year term.
2. Two members shall be chosen from each association.
3. There shall be seven members chosen as at-large members which will properly represent more heavily populated areas of the state.
4. An effort shall be made to ensure balance between pastors and laity, and between male and female; however, the primary consideration for selection of executive board members shall be their expertise to serve effectively.
5. When vacancies occur between annual meetings of the convention, these may be filled upon recommendation of the executive board nominating committee and a two-thirds vote of the executive board present and voting.
6. All members of the board shall be members in good standing of Baptist churches which cooperate with the Convention in its programs of work and the Cooperative Program.
7. A member shall be elected for a term of three years and may be re-elected for a second three-year term. After a lapse of one year he may serve again if elected.
8. Nominees shall hold membership in a BCI affiliated church within the ministry area of an association at least one year before being eligible to serve on the Convention's executive board. Persons moving from an association or at large area to another shall vacate their position on the Board.
9. Members of the Executive Board may be removed in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation, Article IX.

## ARTICLE VIII, DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

1. The executive board shall be the executive, administrative, and promotional agency of the Convention and shall act under the instructions of the Convention, acting in its own capacity as a body through its administrative committee.
2. The executive board shall recommend to the Convention both a proposed goal or objective for raising funds, and a proposed distribution. The board shall promote all missionary, educational and benevolent causes of the Convention, and receive and disburse all funds according to the annual budget adopted by the Convention.
3. The executive board shall have authority to act, as a body or through its administrative committee, in all matters committed to it by the Convention and in matters which may arise between Convention sessions.
4. With the exception of the state office building, the executive board shall have authority to purchase, sell or lease property and to incur indebtedness necessary for the operation of the Convention. The state office building shall not be sold or leased without the approval of the messengers in an annual or called meeting.
5. It shall be the specific duty of each member of the board to promote the Convention's program in his/her respective area of the state.
6. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum after every member has been notified sufficiently in advance.

## ARTICLE IX, THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

1. The Convention shall elect the executive board annually. The president, first vice president, secretary and the chairpersons of the board's standing committees shall serve as the Convention's administrative committee. The standing committees are: Evangelism and Ministries Committee, Missions Committee and Church Health Committee. Standing committees may be changed, added or deleted at the discretion of the executive board. The past president shall serve as ex-officio for one year following his term as president.
2. The president of the Convention shall serve as president of the administrative committee and the recording secretary shall serve as secretary.
3. Members of the administrative committee shall not receive compensation from the Convention budget, nor may members of their immediate families.

## ARTICLE X, DUTIES OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE

1. The administrative committee shall act under the authority of the executive board and/or the Convention in any matter committed to it by the board or by the Convention.
2. The committee shall act on any emergency administrative matter and its action shall carry the authority of the Convention, subject to review by the executive board.
3. The committee shall not involve the Board nor Convention in financial obligations or project any major plans or work not authorized by the Board or the Convention.
4. A majority of the committee shall constitute a quorum after every member has been notified sufficiently in advance.
5. The administrative committee shall serve as the budget and audit committee for the Convention and shall meet with the executive director-treasurer to prepare the budget which is to be presented to the executive board in its September meeting and then the Board shall present the budget to the Convention in its annual session.

## ARTICLE XI, ALTERATIONS

Any alterations may be made in these articles by a vote of two-thirds of the members present when the vote is taken without regard to the total enrollment at any annual meeting of the convention, provided that:

1. Any proposed amendment shall be presented in the book of reports and read on the first day of the Convention.
2. An amendment shall become effective upon approval by two successive Conventions.
3. The Bylaws may be changed by a simple majority vote in Annual Meeting.

### Bylaws Bylaw I – Disbursements

1. All Cooperative Program receipts to the Convention shall be disbursed according to percentages or amounts approved by the Convention in its annual budget.
2. Special gifts - shall be applied according to the instructions of the donors in keeping with charitable contribution laws and the guidelines of the executive board and agency trustees.
3. Undesignated gifts - may be applied as the Convention wills.
4. The treasurer(s) of the Convention funds and institutions shall be bonded for faithful performance of duty, said bond(s) to be approved by the administrative committee of the executive board.

## Bylaw II – MEETINGS

1. The Convention shall choose its meeting times and place.
2. The administrative committee of the executive board, when sufficient emergency arises as to time or place, may change the annual meeting either as to time or place or both.
3. Special meetings of the Convention shall be called by the president upon approval of the administrative committee. Those present, after at least a thirty-day notice has been presented by the president, shall constitute a quorum.
4. The Convention shall use the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order to guide its parliamentary procedures. A parliamentarian may be appointed by the president of the Convention.

## Bylaw III - CONVENTION COMMITTEES

### 1. Committee on Committees:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall serve to nominate members of those committees specifically related to the Convention. These committees shall include a Credentials Committee, Program Committee, Executive Board Nominating Committee, Constitution Review Committee, Resolutions Committee, History Committee and other continuing committees created by the Convention.
- b) Functions: Nominations for members on these committees, including a stipulation of which member shall be chair, shall be presented at the last session of the annual meeting of the Convention. After opportunity for nominations from the floor, these committees shall be elected by the Convention and shall serve from the conclusion of that Convention meeting.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee of five (5) members shall be appointed by the president at the last session of the Convention and shall begin serving at the close of that session. Members shall be appointed for one year. The president shall stipulate which person shall serve as chair.

### 2. Credentials Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall serve as the registration committee for the Convention's annual meeting.
- b) Function: As the Convention's registration committee during the annual meeting of the convention, this committee shall organize necessary procedures to effect the orderly certifying and seating of messengers.

All questions of registration of messengers shall be referred to this committee. This committee shall make reports to the Convention as to numbers of messengers and guests registered.

- c) Composition and Selection: There shall be five (5) members of this committee on a rotating basis with members elected annually for three years.

### 3. Program Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall plan and recommend the program for the annual meeting of the Convention.
- b) Function: This committee shall plan the next annual program sufficiently far in advance that provisional programs can be publicized to the constituency not less than one month before the scheduled meeting of that Convention. This committee shall recommend to the Convention the date and place of meeting for the next two (2) years. Previously published dates and places shall be used except when special reasons for changing are noted and approved by the Convention or the Executive Board.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of five (5) members elected to serve one (1) year.

### 4. Executive Board Nominating Committee:

- a) Purpose: It shall be the purpose of this committee to nominate members of the executive board, stipulating upon which of the three (3) committees they shall serve. It shall also be the responsibility of this committee to nominate the members of the Baptist Foundation Committee.
- b) Function: Annually, seven (7) members shall be nominated for three (3) years for each of the three (3) committees of the executive board, in addition to the filling of vacancies. The committee shall nominate two (2) members each year for a three (3) year term for the Baptist Foundation Committee. The primary consideration of this committee shall be that those persons being nominated shall have special abilities or expertise that equips them to serve effectively in the area of their specified committee. An effort shall be made to see there is geographical representation as well as a balance between ministers and lay persons, and between male and female. Such concern for balance; however, shall not override concern for electing persons with skills to serve on the various committees. (Article VII, Executive Board)

- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of six (6) members serving on a rotating basis, with two (2) elected annually for three (3) years.

5. Baptist Foundation Committee:

- a) Purpose: It shall be the purpose of this committee to serve the Baptist Convention of Iowa by receiving assets to be held and invested for the purpose for which they are received, i.e. scholarships, loan funds, mission funds. (Article II Section 2)
- b) Function: This committee shall receive and invest assets with the Executive Director-Treasurer serving as Chief Executive Officer working with the committee to serve Baptists in Iowa and the causes of Christ.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of six (6) members serving on a rotating basis with two (2) being elected annually for a three year term. A member shall serve no more than two (2) three year terms until the lapse of at least one year. The members shall be nominated to the Convention by the Executive Board Nominating Committee.

6. Constitution Review Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall review the constitution and by-laws for needed updating and revising, and shall receive referrals from the Convention.
- b) Function: This committee shall review the constitution and by-laws to be certain it is in harmony with the corporation charter and is consistent with all procedures and practices adopted by the Convention. This committee shall review and report to the executive board all motions for revision presented during the annual meeting of the Convention and/or to the executive board, with evaluations and recommendations ultimately being made to the Convention. This committee shall assist any messenger in presenting motions for revision to assure he shall be acquainted with proper procedures for amending the constitution and by-laws.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of six (6) members serving on a rotating basis, with two (2) elected annually for three (3) years.

7. Resolutions Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall receive all resolutions presented to the Convention.
- b) Function: All resolutions shall be referred to the Resolutions Committee no later than the first session of the annual meeting of the Convention, although the committee shall not be bound to include resolutions which in the committee's evaluation will not contribute to the unity and advancement of the Convention in their final report unless instructed to do so by two-thirds vote of the Convention.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of five (5) members elected for one (1) year.

8. History Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall be responsible for accumulating, indexing, and communicating to our constituency information about our history.
- b) Function: This committee shall bring to the attention of the Convention occasions when anniversaries or special events need to be commemorated. It shall print in the annual publication brief, updated digests of the history of the Baptist Convention of Iowa.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of three (3) members serving on a rotating basis with one (1) elected annually for three (3) years.

9. Baptist State Paper Committee:

- a) Purpose: This committee shall relate to matters pertaining to the Iowa Baptist.
- b) Function: This committee shall meet with the editor and serve as advisory council in matters of the publication of the state paper.
- c) Composition and Selection: This committee shall be composed of three (3) members serving on a rotating basis with one (1) elected annually for three (3) years. The members of this committee shall be nominated by the Committee on Committees.



## Proceedings Baptist Convention of Iowa Annual Meeting

### Friday- November 3

The eleventh Annual Meeting of the convention was called into session by President Dan Doolin. Pastor Eugene Guthrie was recognized and gave a welcome from the host church. The meeting began in prayer. Worship and music was led by Rob Hewell and Esther Huhn.

Credentials Committee Chairman Marion Livingston reported to the convention that 116 messengers had registered representing 45 churches. The Credentials Committee recommends that these messengers be seated as well as others that are certified as they arrive to attend the meeting. Motion passed.

Eugene Guthrie, chairman of the Program Committee, brought a motion from the committee that the program be accepted as printed and may be adjusted by the president throughout the course of the meeting. Motion passed.

The Program Committee recommends that the 2007 and 2008 annual meeting be held at the Holiday Inn and Suites, Des Moines. CrossPointe Church, West Des Moines and Des Moines Korean Baptist Church will host the 2007 meeting. That Ridgecrest Baptist Church, Council Bluffs, Crossroads Community Church, Grimes and Sendero de Salvacion, Storm Lake will be the hosts of the 2008 meeting. Motion passed.

President Dan Doolin asked Vice President Bob Stout to preside as he encouraged the messengers to read and become familiar with the Annual Report listed in their program. The work of Chris Caywood, the beginning of the Mississippi River Ministry and the expertise of Carl Deaton as auditor were brought to the convention's attention.

### BCI Annual Meeting - Saturday Morning – November 4

Be it finally RESOLVED, that we urge churches to enter into and vigorously support education programs for children and youth that will provide biblically-based education.

#### Resolution on Banning Same-Sex Unions

WHEREAS, Popular culture is continuing to redefine the biblical model of Marriage and family; and

WHEREAS, Proponents of same-sex “marriage” have indicated their intention to challenge state laws and the federal Defense of Marriage Act, which define marriage as between one man and one woman; and

WHEREAS, Jesus states that marriage is a sacred, lifelong bond between one man and one woman (Matthew 19:4-6); and

WHEREAS, Legalizing same-sex “marriage” would convey a societal approval of a homosexual lifestyle, which the Bible calls sinful and dangerous both to the individuals involved and to society at large (Romans 1:24-27; 1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Leviticus 18:22); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the messengers to the Baptist Convention of Iowa meeting in Des Moines, Iowa, November 3-4, 2006, affirm that legal and biblical marriage can only occur between one man and one woman; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we continue to oppose steadfastly all efforts by any court or state legislature to validate or legalize same-sex marriage or other equivalent unions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we commit ourselves to pray for and support legislative and legal efforts to oppose the legalization of same-sex marriage or other equivalent unions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we commit ourselves to pray for and support legislative and legal efforts to oppose the legalization of the same-sex unions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call on Southern Baptist churches to commit to guard our religious liberty to recognize and perform marriages as defined by Scripture; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we at the Baptist Convention of Iowa support a constitutional Amendment to the Iowa Constitution banning same-sex unions and defining marriage as that union between one man and one woman; and be it finally

RESOLVED, That we call on Southern Baptists not only to stand against same-sex unions, but to demonstrate our love for those practicing homosexuality by sharing with them the forgiving and transforming power of the gospel of Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 6:9-11).

All were passed by the convention. Dan Doolin led the convention in prayer for our nation and for God's working in our lives.

Miscellaneous Business - President Dan Doolin asked messengers if there was any miscellaneous business to consider. No business was brought to the President's attention.

Marion Livingston, chair of the Credentials Committee gave a final count of messengers and visitors to the convention. The final count is 122 messengers with 44 churches represented and 26 guests attending.

A motion was made that the convention take a fifteen minute break. This motion was quickly seconded and passed with great enthusiasm. The convention took the break asked for with the understanding that the Miscellaneous Business portion would be concluded upon their return.

After the break a testimony was given by those involved with Campers on Mission.

Pastors Bob Stine and Eugene Guthrie brought scripture, meditation and prayer in keeping with the theme of "Abide in Christ".

Executive Director-Treasurer Jimmy Barrentine brought his report to the convention. The messengers were informed and blessed by his continued service and leadership to our state. Jonette Appleton, Phyllis Hoth and Bobbi Thies were recognized for their valued and faithful service to the convention.

Rob Hewell and Esther Huhn blessed the convention with music and song.

Bob Feeler blessed the convention with a message from scripture.

President Dan Doolin closed the convention meeting by asking Rev. Orville Kool of Orange City to pray for the convention and for God's leadership. The convention adjourned.

## REPORTS OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

### President's Report

Dan Doolin

The scripture teaches us in Hebrews 13:8 that, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." This fact becomes a major stabilizer in our lives as we face the many changes that come on a daily basis.

This annual meeting will conclude my tenure as president of the Baptist Convention of Iowa. In the past twenty-four months, I have been privileged to serve Iowa Baptists and to experience the many changes that have come our way as a convention.

This year we have experienced a significant change in staff as the Holy Spirit has called and redirected the faithful servants of this convention in new ministry and life assignments. We are grateful for the service that Ronnie Reynolds, Associational Missionary, gave to the Northeast Association and continue to pray for him and his wife as they have made this transition in their lives. We pray for God's continued blessing upon the Reynolds and celebrate the work they accomplished while with us. Another significant staff change came when Chris Caywood, BCI Business Manager, resigned this summer to fulfill the call of God to become Pastor of Discipleship at Markham Street Baptist Church, Little Rock, Arkansas. Chris and his family are deeply missed by the Iowa Baptist family and we will always be indebted to them for their faithful service. I am proud to call Chris my friend and I know he would not have made this transition in ministry without the direct leadership of the Holy Spirit. But change is never a surprise to God. As he led Chris away from us, he prepared the next servant to come. I am happy to report that Ms. Bobbie Thies, has assumed the role as Financial Secretary and is doing a wonderful job.

As I speak about change, it is nice to celebrate the fact that some things have not changed. Jonette Appleton has completed twenty years of service and Jimmy Barrentine has completed his fifth year of service. As President of the Convention, I commend both of these servants for their dedication, first to the Lord and then to our churches. One of the joys in serving Iowa Baptists as president is having the wonderful privilege to work with people like Jonette, Jimmy, and the entire BCI staff.

The challenge for our convention is significant. We are still very dependent upon the mission dollars from the North American Mission Board. In fact, if it were not for the support of our mission board, many of the things we value as a convention simply would not be! I believe the associations are poised to help this convention grow and to set new landmarks along the way.

Growing up is tough, but necessary. I believe our associations need to embrace the challenge of supporting the salary of the missionary. I believe the associations need to champion the road to starting new churches. And I believe our churches need to view the Baptist Convention of Iowa as a ministry partner rather than a ministry provider.

The structure of the BCI has developed greatly under the leadership of its Executive Director, Jimmy Barrentine. Jimmy has worked very hard to balance leadership and to broaden the base of decision making. The Administrative Committee has been called upon in a variety of convention issues to give guidance and leadership and have made appropriate recommendation to the Executive Board for final decision. Property issues have required a significant amount of work from the Executive Director in conjunction with work from the Administrative Committee and final decision from the Executive Board. A major project that is now underway is the revision and updating of the Convention Policy and Procedure Manual. These comments are all indications how the convention is growing and how it requires the work of many to keep the convention strong.

I would like to give another challenge to this convention. As you walk in the present office building of the BCI, you will quickly realize that space is a major factor. The offices of the staff are so small and the space so tightly packed, that I am sometimes amazed at how our ministry servants are able to accomplish their work. If this convention grows, which I hope it does, there simply is no space for a new staff person to locate. Our BCI office is also coming to the place when renovation is becoming necessary. I would like to challenge the churches of the BCI to begin to pray about this issue and work with the new Administrative Committee, President, and our Executive Director to dream a dream about how we can take the next step of development and plan to expand the office space of the BCI. This issue may not be deemed as necessary by some, but I believe it is becoming critical. The BCI is not a figure head group. It is the workhorse for many of our churches. We are not talking about the “people in Des Moines,” we are talking about who we are. It is time to dream!

In closing, I thank the churches of the BCI for the opportunity to serve you as your president. It has been a task that I have often felt ill equipped for and very humbled by. I greatly thank Brother Jimmy for his valuable leadership and help along the way. Thank you for your prayer support and your trust. I have not taken either one of these lightly. People will change positions, structures will change, churches will change, but our Lord never changes. May we continue to serve him with this steadfast knowledge and determination!

The committee has led in celebrating 50 years of Southern Baptist work in Iowa. Dr. Joe Needham, a member of this committee, has begun a process during this last year of organizing, preserving and indexing documents collected during the past 50 years.

The History Committee congratulates: Jimmy Barrentine, who has completed five years serving as Executive Director-Treasurer of the Baptist Convention of Iowa, and Jonette Appleton who has completed 20 years service on the staff of Iowa Southern Baptists.

First Baptist Church, Dunkerton celebrated their 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year.

Bob Luebbert of Northwood was recognized as the Iowa pastor of the year.

Several pastors retired this year: Claude McFerron retired from Calvary, Marshalltown after a total of 61 years in the ministry. Larry Carter retired from Calvary Baptist Church of Clinton. Ernie Brooks retired from Living Hope Community Church of Des Moines. Gus Carnes retired from Grandview Heights Baptist Church of Dubuque and Bruce Allen from Calvary Baptist Church of Indianola.

### Resolutions Committee Report

Resolutions may be submitted to the resolutions committee for review and coordination any time during the year, and not later than the end of the first session of the annual meeting. The committee shall present to the convention at the annual meeting such resolutions as shall be of interest to the convention.

Report of the Programs of Work  
Jimmy Barrentine, Executive Director-Treasurer

The Convention is seeking to faithfully keep four promises made in the strategy plan approved in last year's annual meeting. Those promises are: 1) Help the churches reach people for Christ. 2) Help the churches start new churches where and when needed. 3) Help the churches stay healthy. 4) Help the churches strengthen their local associations

All of us understand that the Convention is not the primary arena in which God works. Scripture references the church, not conventions, as the bride of Christ. Consequently, we want to be careful not to claim for the Convention what God is doing through the churches.

With that as the context, God is at work and progress is being made. Six new churches were started in 2005 and three to date in 2006. For the fourth year in a row, baptisms are up, with an increase of just under 10% in this reporting year. Seven churches doubled their baptisms from a year ago.

Disaster Relief responses have done much to strengthen associations and to help the churches stay healthy as Iowa volunteers have given of themselves to share the Gospel and to meet temporal needs. The Friendship Baptist Center added to the health profile of the churches by extending ministry to over 9,800 people.

This reporting period has been marked by a notable anniversary and by a notable addition to the staff. Jonette Appleton has been with us for 20 years. Jonette's anniversary was celebrated with a reception in the September meeting of the Executive Board. Bobbie Thies joined the staff family in June as the ministry associate for business and finance. She has added strength to our commitment to conduct the Convention's financial activities at the highest possible level of integrity and professionalism.

We also lost staff this past year. Ronnie Reynolds retired from the Northeast Baptist Association and the Convention. Chris Caywood moved to Arkansas to serve as the administrative and discipleship pastor at Markham Street Baptist Church in Little Rock. Troy Fiscella departed as the youth evangelism consultant, but continues to live in Grimes. We wish the Father's best for each of these men and their families.

We can also praise the Father for the decreased level of conflict experienced by the churches this past year. It seems that more and more church members have discovered Proverbs 15:1, "A gentle answer will calm a person's anger, but an unkind answer will cause more anger." Learning to calm the waters rather than escalating the level of conflict is a lesson of grace and peace that the Lord Jesus always stands ready to teach us.

### Missions Team

Steve Murdock, Missions Team Leader

Sometimes a year seems only to last a couple of months. This year has certainly gone by fast. It has been a trying year but also one of great blessing. There have been many challenges, but the Lord is blessing Baptist missions in Iowa.

1. Six new church starts affiliated with the Baptist Convention of Iowa were started in 2005, and three so far have been started in 2006. There are now 100 SBC-related churches in Iowa.
2. In 2006, 52 projects for the Tennessee-Iowa Connection (new name for the Tennessee-Iowa Partnership) were submitted by Iowa churches to the Tennessee Baptist Convention. Twenty-eight projects were filled. One hundred fifty-three Iowa volunteers and 265 Tennessee volunteers helped with Iowa projects in 2006. Three Iowa churches filled project requests for sister Iowa churches. Sixty-nine people made a profession of faith in Jesus, nineteen rededicated their lives to Christ ten others made other types of spiritual decisions as a result of the Tennessee-Iowa Connection. The partnership is scheduled to be renewed for another three years at the end of 2007.
3. This year, missions education and WMU leadership returned to the Missions Team from the Evangelism Team. At the time of this writing, the WMU director's position is still vacant. The search continues.
4. The Northeast Iowa Southern Baptist Association is currently looking for a new area missionary. A search committee has been formed and is working toward finding God's leader for the position.
5. The Missions Team has assisted with sixteen church planters and pastors of struggling churches over the past year.
6. The goal for this year's William and Garlinda Hyde State Missions Offering is \$50,000 with the everything over \$40,000 to be split 50/50 between church planting and disaster relief. The 2005 goal was \$40,000. Money received amounted to \$32,385.
7. Missions training scheduled for 2006 are Associational Assessment and Strategy Planning October 27 and Indigenous Church Planting training October 27-28 in Des Moines.

To God be the glory for the great things He is doing in Baptist missions in Iowa.

Evangelism & Ministries Team  
Ty Berry, Team Leader

The Evangelism and Ministries team is here to assist you upon your request for evangelism and its related needs.

Team members: Ty Berry, Team Leader, Jon and Mindy Jamison, Co-Directors of the Friendship Baptist Center, Des Moines, Iowa.

Our churches across Iowa have been encouraged to engage in intentional evangelism through their local ministry in the community. We have entered our first year of *Empowering Kingdom Growth* emphasis that embraces abiding in Christ, holding to each other, and reaching out to others.

Baptisms across Iowa this year saw a 9.7% increase over last year. This marks the fourth consecutive year of increases in baptisms.

Our annual Men's Retreat held at the Y-Conference Center, Boone, Iowa saw 126 men gather to hear Don Gibson with Blackaby Ministries International, who lead the retreat. Men reported it was an excellent retreat and a great time of fellowship.

Disaster Relief response and training have experienced dramatic increases. We now have over 300 trained volunteers in disaster relief. Our annual training event, held at First Baptist Winterset, saw 104 gather for updates, training and information. The Baptist Convention of Iowa disaster relief units (food unit and chainsaw unit), assisted in Mississippi and Louisiana, with 74 Iowans assisting in serving 975,000 meals and hundreds of trees and yards cleaned.

Summer and Semester Missionaries: We had 21 summer and semester missionaries serving in Iowa churches this past year. Several states were represented in Iowa this year: Iowa, Arizona, Mississippi, Texas, Tennessee, Illinois and North Carolina.

Domestic Hunger Ministry: We presently have fifteen crisis food pantries that are assisted by the Baptist Convention of Iowa. Along with the Friendship Baptist Center, Des Moines, we have served over 11,450 people with domestic hunger issues. We have witnessed an increase in professions of faith through the ministry.

Impact University was held in July at Buena Vista University, Storm Lake, Iowa. We had 172 in attendance, 75 recommitments to Christ, 7 professions of faith and 21 vocational decisions for Christian ministries. "Army of One" was the theme that challenged teens to follow Christ, to stand firm in their journey, and share the Good News with their generation.

Great Commission Prayer Conference in conjunction with the Kingdom Growth Convocation held at Grace West Church was a two day event focused on sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ and evangelistic praying. Twenty-seven workshops were offered each with a local church design on evangelism, church health, and missions.

Church Health Team  
Richard D. Nations, Team Leader

To support the *Empowering Kingdom Growth* strategy, the Church Health Team strives to “...build up the body of Christ” (Eph. 4:12), which is part of our purpose statement.

The team uses several contract consultants to accomplish Church Health ministry. This year Mike Roberts and Jay McFarling transitioned out of the seminary extension consultant roles. Paul Dykstra is now leading the Midwestern Seminary extension site and the Seminary Extension Centers promotion. Paul is an associate pastor at Grace Church, Des Moines. Dr. Deland Myers resigned as the adult consultant. The youth consultant position is also vacant. Dianna Sparks is the children/preschool consultant. Rachel Nations leads the special education consulting role and Dan Wiersema is the pastor and worship consultant for the team. Chuck Spindler heads up Sunday school and discipleship consulting and provides leadership for the training group to assist the team leader. These leaders are outstanding people to work with and they respond positively to requests for training and help.

Two new assignments were received by the team recently. Stewardship promotion and assisting churches without pastors with training for pastor search committees and resume referrals are the new duties. In addition to coordinating collegiate ministries and developing seminary extension opportunities, the team is primarily responsible for the work of church growth and Christian education.

2005-06 notable accomplishments are:

- We trained 384 leaders from 38 different churches last year.
- 16 churches committed to linking up with another church to hold a VBS last year.
- 117 children and youth have been saved through VBS efforts so far this year.
- 63 college students accepted Christ in BCI-related collegiate ministries this year.
- Sunday school average attendance grew by almost 4% in Iowa last year.

Iowa churches are ministering to eight college and university campuses. The team works with churches and associations to coordinate Bible studies, worship sessions and discipling efforts. Three new churches that have networked with the convention to do college ministry are: Southern Hills Baptist, Sioux City; New Life Church, Dubuque and Grace Church, Des Moines. Established ministries continue functioning through the following churches and associations: Cornerstone Church, Ames (The Salt Company); Shiloh Church, Cedar Falls; University Baptist, Ames (CrossSeekers); First Baptist, Lamoni (Harvest), All Nations Baptist, Iowa City and Metro Baptist Association, Des Moines (Alpha and Omega).

The Vacation Bible School training group led VBS seminars in five locations this spring. Two associations held their own seminar, after being trained by the state training group. Associations are responding to the challenge to provide their own training teams next year and the convention team will be prepared to equip these association teams.
